At risk students that have failed in the traditional educational setting, are succeeding in Capers Preparatory Christian Academy. She currently has 30 students and 50 on the waiting list. Every one that has completed 8th grade thus far has graduated and are going to college. Tuition is \$5,000 a year and almost every student cannot afford it, as they are from a single parent home. The school is a 501 IIIc, and the children qualify for Title 1 lunches. It sounds like a great program that is running on a shoe string and needs public support.
